



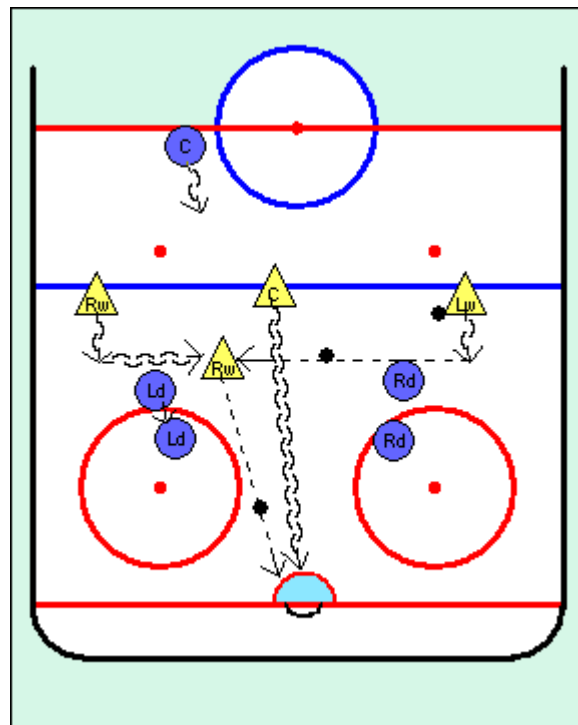
*“On a 3 on 2, make at least one defencemen believe he has two coverages”*

### OFFENSIVE ZONE – 3 ON 2 – CENTRE TO NET

When we come over the red line towards their blue line with 3 players against 2 of their defencemen when our left-winger has the puck and it is a clear 3 on 2 with none of their back checking forwards close to us, one good play is for our centre to skate hard between the defencemen to the net, while at the same time our left-winger slows down and the right-winger fades slightly back and to the middle shot ready.

Both defencemen should be a little flat footed as the centre goes by either trying to slow him down or moving slightly with him. This should allow our right-winger the time and space to be open for a pass from our left-winger and a good shot on net. Our centre going to the net should be screening the goalie.

### SPEED CHANGES CONFUSE THE DEFENCE



This play is designed for the winger that has an excellent slap or snap shot. It works better if the right-winger is a left hand shot.

**REMEMBER: THE WAY TO DEFEAT THIS PLAY IF YOU ARE DEFENDING IS FOR A FORWARD TO BACKCHECK AND COVER THE FADING RIGHT-WINGER AS HE POSITIONS HIMSELF DEEP OR FOR ONE OF THE DEFENCEMAN TO INTERCEPT OR DEFLECT THE PASS TO THE RIGHT-WINGER.**
